Re:	Opposition to Changing Common Nomenclature of
	Emergency Medical Services (EMS) to
	"Paramedicine" in the United States

1	WHEREAS, the common term "Emergency
2	Medical Services" (EMS) is a term recognized by
3	both providers and the public in the United States to
4	define out-of-hospital care; and
5	WHEREAS, EMS care is provided by four levels
6	of EMS providers, which are identified by national
7	consensus titles including: Emergency Medical
8	Responder (EMR), Emergency Medical Technician
9	(EMT), Advanced Emergency Medical Technician
10	(AEMT), and Paramedic; and
11	WHEREAS, these provider levels correspond to
12	education standards along with both state and
13	National Registry examinations, and are the most
14	commonly used terms for certification and licensure
15	in all 50 states and United States territories; and
16	WHEREAS, the training and education for each
17	of these provider levels is based on practical analysis.
18	core competencies, scope of practice, and education
19	standards; and
20	WHEREAS, each level is distinctly different and
21	their titles reflect the proper title for each level of
22	EMS providers; and
23	WHEREAS, the present subset of EMS providers
24	practicing as paramedics in the U.S. represents fewer
25	numbers than any of the other levels; and
26	WHEREAS, some leaders of the EMS industry
27	desire to replace the name "Emergency Medical

28	Services" with the blanket term "Paramedicine"; and
29	WHEREAS, standardizing the reference to all
30	providers as "paramedics" would create confusion
31	among providers, the public, and EMS services
32	agencies; therefore be it
33	RESOLVED, That the IAFF opposes eliminating
34	the commonly accepted nomenclature of EMR,
35	EMT, AEMT and Paramedic to name all provider
36	levels "Paramedic"; and be it further
37	RESOLVED, That the IAFF supports the position
38	that all fire fighters, EMS providers, and government
39	agencies continue to use the common term
40	"Emergency Medical Services" and the common
41	nomenclature for EMR, EMT, AEMT, and
42	Paramedic; and be it further
43	RESOLVED, That the IAFF will oppose any
44	legislative or rule making attempts to eliminate the
45	commonly accepted term "Emergency Medical
46	Services" and the common nomenclature for EMR,
47	EMT, AEMT, and Paramedic.
