## **Revised Resolution No. 53**

## **COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENT: Legislative**

Re:	Support for National Firefighter Cancer
	<b>Awareness Month</b>

1	WHEREAS, firefighter occupational cancer is the
2	leading cause of line of duty deaths in professional
3	firefighters and has reached epidemic levels in the
4	United States; and
5	WHEREAS, in 2017, 74% of the names of fallen
6	firefighters added to the IAFF Memorial Wall of
7	Honor in Colorado Springs were attributed to
8	occupational cancers; and
9	WHEREAS, firefighters have a 9% greater
10	chance of developing cancer and a 14% greater risk
11	of dying from that cancer than the general
12	population; and
13	WHEREAS, the excess cancer risk among
14	firefighters reflects chronic exposure to known
15	carcinogens and other hazards as part of job-related
16	tasks and responsibilities; and
17	WHEREAS, current cultural norms preclude
18	firefighters and fire service leaders from consistently
19	recognizing the global scope of exposure in the fire
20	service work environment, largely due to the latency
21	periods of cancers onset and progression (5-35
22	years); and
23	WHEREAS, due to the latency period of cancer
24	diseases and continued exposure to occupational
25	contaminants will continue to adversely impact fire
26	department personnel for many years in the future;
27	And
28	WHEREAS, many departments have not yet

29 created cancer awareness programs are not operating 30 with best practices as it pertains to occupational 31 contamination and risk reduction protocols; and 32 WHEREAS, many departments do not have the 33 guidance or resources to create and implement a 34 program of firefighter contamination and risk 35 reduction procedures for cancer prevention; and 36 WHEREAS, firefighter contamination and cancer 37 risk reduction procedures are the first line of defense 38 for reducing the incidence of cancer in the fire 39 service; and 40 WHEREAS, many departments do not have the 41 necessary resources to create and implement a 42 program of cancer prevention and early detection to 43

reduce the cancer burden among their members; and

WHEREAS, early detection of cancer through routine screening leads to earlier treatment, associated with better disease outcomes, including improved survival and reduced morbidity; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to support and develop a national firefighter cancer research strategy to direct future research efforts, including underrepresented firefighter populations of female firefighters, minority firefighters, volunteer firefighters, and wildland firefighters; and

WHEREAS, the general population needs to be made aware of the cancer risk for firefighters so that we can gain enough legislative support for all 50 states to establish a presumptive disability clause in each states labor code (currently only 33 states cover firefighters for one or more cancers under workers' compensation as a result of presumptive legislation); therefore be it

66	developing partnerships and collaborations directed
67	at providing fire service personnel the training, best
68	practices, early detection and prevention programs
69	necessary to reduce occupational cancer risk; and be

71	RESOLVED, The IAFF in conjunction with the
72	Firefighter Cancer Support Network will provide
73	scientific research, training resources and a
74	collaboration for fire service members of the country
75	to share information and best practices to reduce
76	preventable cancer risk to firefighters; and be it

78	RESOLVED, That a focused month will create
79	increased cancer awareness.
